

### Asymptomatic stag-horn calculus as a cause of persistent pyuria in a case of diabetes



A 60 year male was admitted as DM type 2 with upper urinary tract sepsis. His KUB revealed a big calculus on one side. USG revealed a large stag horn calculus in renal pelvis. In spite of such a big pelvic calculus renal DTPA scan revealed a GFR of 45ml/min in the involved kidney, as against 55 ml/min of the normal one. [IJEM 2008;12(5):31]
